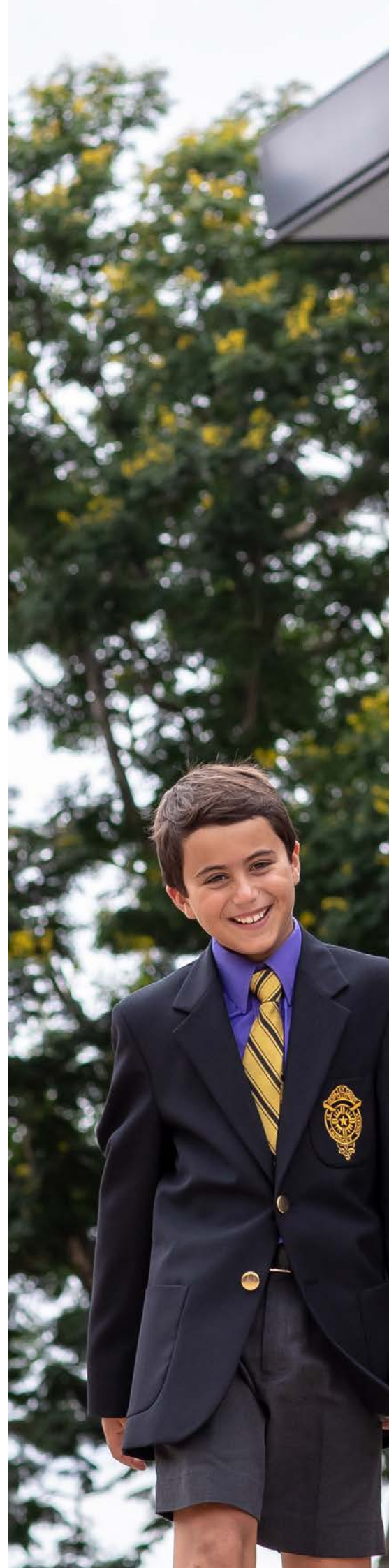

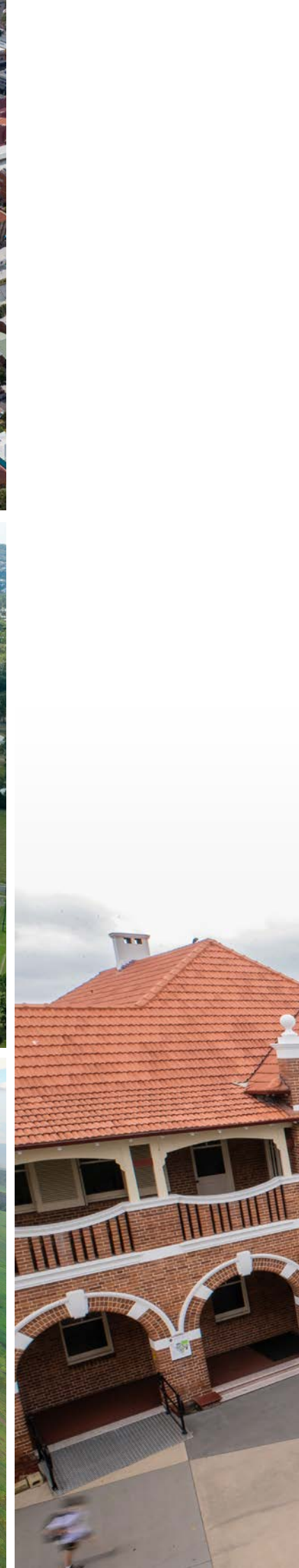

Facilities

St Laurence's College offers outstanding facilities across three purpose-built and thoughtfully designed campuses, harnessing the perfect blend of original buildings and modern, student-centred learning spaces.

St Laurence's College has exceptional buildings, grounds and facilities which are conducive to promoting an effective learning environment.

Special features include air-conditioned, well-equipped classrooms, science and computer laboratories, library plus specialist rooms for music, television, graphics, design and technology. These facilities are complemented by a modern 1,500 seat Performing Arts Centre, Chapel, rooftop field, STEM building and indoor Sports Centre.

The College's playing fields are located at Runcorn, adjacent to the railway station. Nine fields are enhanced by new change rooms and a function centre.

St Laurence's College outdoor education centre, Camp Laurence, is located on five hectares on the western bank of Lake Moogerah.

The staff of St Laurence's College are a highly qualified, experienced, and generous group of professionals who consistently contribute more than would be otherwise expected both within the classroom and beyond.

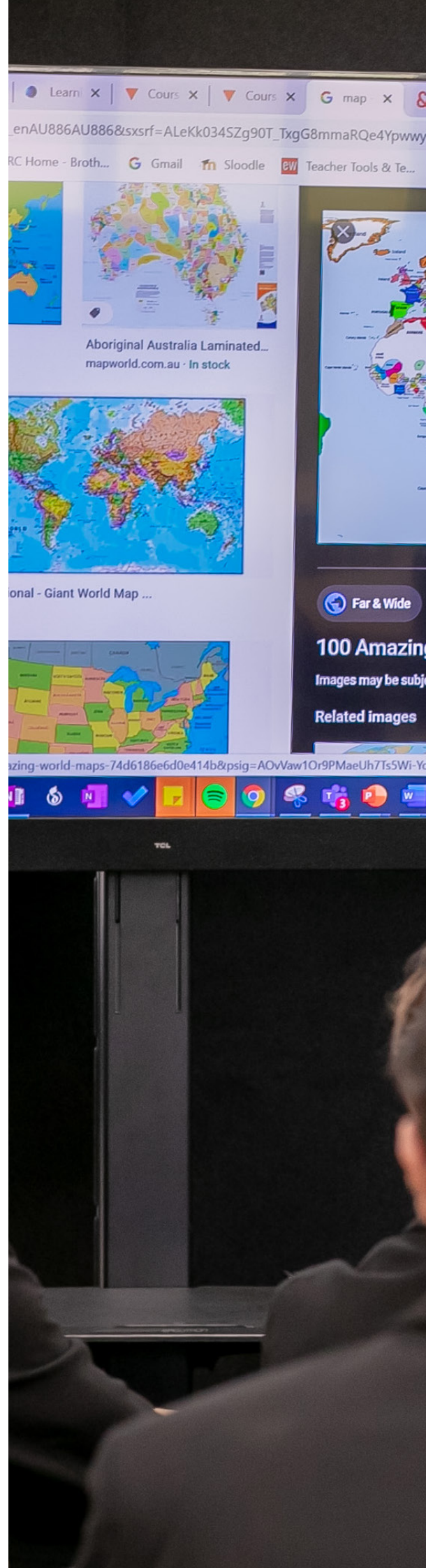
The distinctive skills/qualifications and experience of the staff include:

Teaching staff are available before and after school hours to provide academic subject tutorials to students who are looking to improve or excel in their subject area.

Students are allocated a Staff House Mentor who is responsible for the daily pastoral care of their students over the lifetime of their enrolment. Parents are encouraged to maintain regular contact with their son's House Mentor for updates and general enquiries.

Most staff members are responsible for leading one or more co-curricular sport, music or faith and learning activities giving them the opportunity to connect with the boys outside of the classroom environment.



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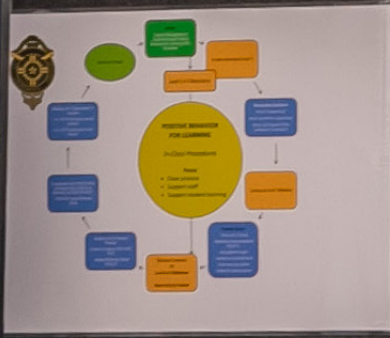
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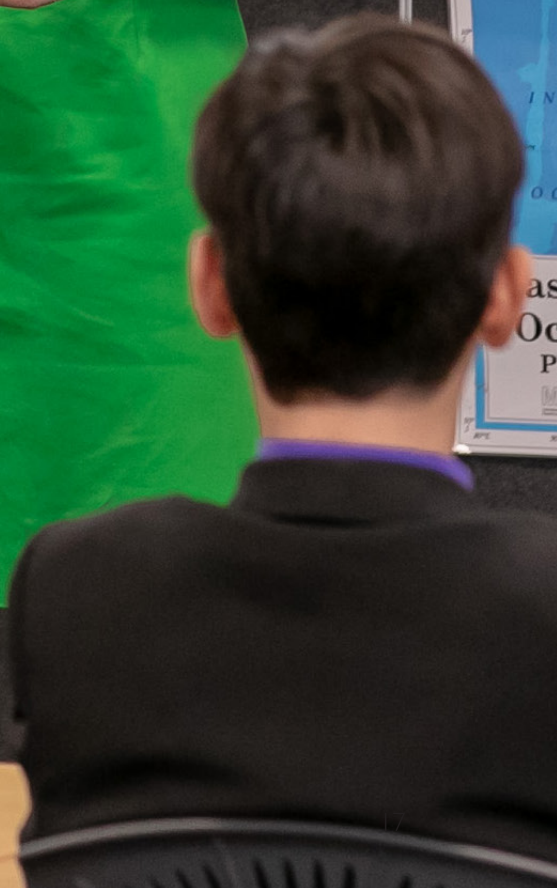
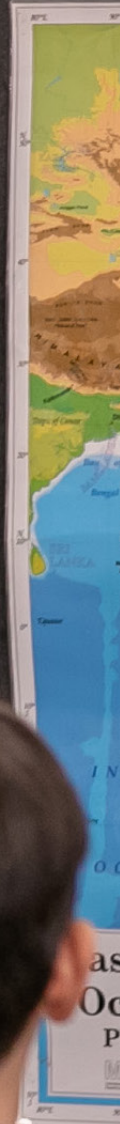
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
