All applications are prioritised based on the date of receipt of the application, as well as considering a range of criteria when making enrolment offers. Please see our website for more details on how we assess our applications.

APPLICATION FEE

AUD\$300 is payable with an application for enrolment. Except as prescribed in the Refund Policy (*Wesley College Enrolment Procedures – International*), this fee is neither refundable nor transferable. This fee is waived for children and grandchildren of Old Wesley Collegians.

CONFIRMATION FEE

AUD\$1,500 is payable to confirm the enrolment. Except as prescribed in the Refund Policy (*Wesley College Enrolment Procedures – International*), this fee is neither refundable nor transferable.

ANNUAL FEES

Fees are made up of four compulsory components – a Tuition Fee, an Infrastructure Levy, an International Student Levy, and a Consolidated Charge.

- The Tuition Fee, the Infrastructure Levy and the International Student Levy are payable in advance on 1 October 2024 for Semester 1 2025, and are billed on 1 April 2025 for Semester 2 2025
- The Consolidated Charge is billed during the year of tuition on 1 April 2025 for Semester 1 2025 and on 1 October 2025 for Semester 2 2025. Year 12 students will be billed their annual Consolidated Charge in full on 1 April 2025, together with the final Tuition Fee
- GST is not applicable to either the Tuition Fee, the Infrastructure Levy nor the International Student Levy. The Consolidated Charge, however, includes some services to which GST is applicable

Wesley College operates on two semesters: a total of two study periods per year.

- Semester 1 comprises Terms 1 and 2, from late January through to June, with a holiday break in April
- Semester 2 comprises Terms 3 and 4, from July through to December, with a holiday break in September

Fees, as outlined in the letter of offer, are payable on confirmation of enrolment, for the first two study periods of the course. Thereafter, fees are payable in two instalments per year, billed on 1 April and 1 October.

The College has a three-month instalment option for families to settle the 1 October and 1 April semester invoices. Please note, settlement of the Semester 1 2025 school fee invoice is confirmation of your re-enrolment with Wesley College and acceptance of the College's published terms and conditions as updated from time to time on the website. The College Associate Director, College Treasury & Secretary is authorised by the Wesley College Council to take whatever steps are deemed necessary to recover overdue accounts.

International Student Levy payable by Semester*

The International Student Levy of AUD\$5,406 applies to all non-permanent resident students.

*Should residency status change, please provide evidence to Wesley College. Any account adjustment will be made from the date of advice to the College.

Consolidated Charge payable by Semester

This charge covers extras such as some excursions, Library resources, the College diary and yearbook, some textbooks in early years and some stationery. It also covers materials for the laboratory curriculum, study centre and career centre.

This charge also covers camps held in Years 4–10, except for the Year 6 Canberra tour, the Year 9 Clunes Program and Year 10 Yiramalay Induction Program, which are billed separately.

A proportion of fees collected by the College may be used to support the operation of the ECLC.

RESIDENTIAL FEES

Learning in Residence (boarding)

Learning in Residence is offered at the Glen Waverley campus only. The fees are payable in two, half yearly instalments.

Year 9 Clunes Program

The total cost of the Year 9 Clunes Program is AUD\$5,500 for the eight-week term the student is at Clunes. This cost is in addition to the Tuition Fee and will be billed prior to the student attending Clunes.

Year 10 Yiramalay Induction Program

The total cost for the three-week Year 10 Yiramalay Induction Program is \$TBD with Studio Schools Australia (excluding airfares which will be charged at cost). This cost is in addition to the Tuition Fee and Consolidated Charge and will be billed prior to the student attending Yiramalay.

Health cover

The Australian Government requires that all international students holding student visas must have Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) for the entire period of their student visa and stay in Australia. Please refer to the Department of Immigration and Border Protection website www.border.gov.au for all relevant information. It is the responsibility of applicants to purchase OSHC prior to commencing the online visa application and provide evidence of the policy and cover dates to Wesley College prior to commencement.

NOTICE OF WITHDRAWAL

One term's notice in writing to the Head of Campus is required advising the withdrawal of a student from the College, otherwise a charge equivalent to one term's fees will apply. This means that notice is required by the end of Term 3.

Two term's notice is required advising the withdrawal of a student from four-year-old ECLC. This means that notice is required at the end of the Term 2, otherwise a fee equivalent to one term's fees will be payable.

DISCOUNTS

Family discounts

At Wesley, coeducation is central to our vision for learning, as is our commitment to keeping children in one family together.

A family discount applies where three or more children are at Wesley College, the discount is applied to the Tuition Fee only at 20% for the third child and 50% for the fourth and any subsequent children. *

* A 10% discount for a second child is also available when a third child has commenced, and enrolments are concurrent.

If you are eligible for the discount, it is automatically applied to your account.

The family discount does not apply to the Consolidated Charge, Infrastructure Levy or any other fees and charges that are billed to your account.

Families who have been granted other forms of fee assistance may not be entitled to family discounts.

Early payment discount

A discount of 2.5% is available if the total annual fees are paid in advance e.g., 2025 by 31 October 2024.

The discount applies to the Tuition Fees and Consolidated Charge only.

EXPENSES

Estimated weekly living expenses

It is estimated that each student will require approximately AUD\$100-AUD\$150 per week to cover the following expenses:

- Transport
- Mobile phone
- Accommodation
- Medical
- Pocket money for miscellaneous items such as haircuts, clothing, entertainment, eating out, etc.

Other expenses

Further costs will be incurred for the purchase of a uniform (range from AUD\$1,000 – AUD\$1,500), books and stationery (approximately AUD\$500), and any sports equipment required.
