About St Catherine's School Sydney

St Catherine's was established in 1856 – celebrating 166 years in 2022. St Catherine's is Australia's oldest independent Anglican School for girls.

We are a Kindergarten to Year 12 day and boarding school with 1050 students enrolled.

St Catherine's school is located in the exclusive eastern suburbs of Sydney. Waverley is a safe residential area – a short distance from the famous Bondi Beach and Bondi Junction shopping centre.

Our students are encouraged to experience everything Sydney has to offer, which includes an outdoor lifestyle. Close by are the beautiful Queens Park and Centennial Parks. where boarders love to walk and exercise. The CBD and Sydney domestic and international airports are a short 20-minutes drive away.

St Catherine's has strong connections with three prestigious boys' schools; The Scots College, Cranbrook School and Waverley College.

As most of our overseas students become boarders this brochure includes a strong boarding focus.

Academic benefits

St Catherine's teaching is intentionally tailored to girls - this environment encourages and stimulates thought provoking discussions. Research has proven that girls in single sex schools achieve higher academic outcomes, and have higher self-belief, selfesteem and confidence.

Following your daughter's commencement, the Years 7–12 mentors are the student's and parent's first point of contact at the school. The year mentor is responsible for the holistic development of each girl. They know all students, their strengths and areas for development, well.

Year mentors also work closely with boarding staff to ensure continuity of care for each girl.

All senior school students, day girls and boarders can use the research centre (library) from 7.30am until the start of school at 8.20am, and at recess and lunch. The prep centre runs from 3.30pm - 5.30pm and Years 11 and 12 students may remain in the prep centre until 9.00pm.

The prep centre is a wonderful resource where students have access to teaching staff, who provide homework support and mentorship



Academic curriculum

St Catherine's offers a comprehensive range of subjects from Years 7–10. From Year 7, students study: English, mathematics, science, history, PDHPE, French or Chinese, Latin, music, technology, visual arts and biblical studies. From Year 8 your daughter will choose two electives and will continue with these in Year 9. From Year 10 your daughter will add one more elective.

St Catherine's offers one of the broadest academic curriculums, with 40 HSC courses offered at the school.

Planning for the future

Choosing the right electives and career guidance is crucial when planning the future opportunities available to your daughter. Our tertiary advisor works closely with students to provide advice and support. Alumni speakers and other workplace professionals regularly visit the school and share their experiences and advice. Furthermore, universities conduct open days and online events which the girls are encouraged to attend.



2020-2021 **HSC** results

St Catherine's offers the Higher School Certificate (HSC). HSC examinations are completed in the final year of senior school. The marks determine the Australian Tertiary Admissions Rank (ATAR), which enables students to enter a university in Australia or overseas. The HSC/ATAR is recognised internationally. The majority of St Catherine's students study at The University of Sydney, The University of NSW, The University of Technology Sydney or The Australian National University.

St Catherine's is an academically non-selective school, and given this, student's results are consistently outstanding.

Of special note, in 2021, St Catherine's students came first in the state in both Advanced and Standard English. Also, St Catherine's students placed third place in Spanish Continuers, third place in Science Extension, fifth place in Science Extension and fifth place in Drama in NSW.

The Boarding House

The boarding house is your daughter's home away from home.

The boarding house accommodates 67 students from Australia and overseas. Our boarding house has been recently restored and has modern living areas with predominately single rooms, ensuring privacy for study and rest. All girls are encouraged to add a personal touch to their rooms.

Delicious, varied and nutritionally balanced meals are prepared by our chef. Boarders have access to Netflix, Smart TVs, and there is WiFi in all areas of the boarding house. Boarders can utilise the school's facilities including the swimming pool, sports centre, tennis and basketball courts, music practice rooms and gymnasium.

Academic benefits

The boarding house fosters a culture of hard work, academic rigour and an environment where effort is valued and encouraged. Our boarding students thrive on structure and routine.

Close communication between class teachers and boarding house staff ensure the girls' study program meets the expectations of girls, their parents and teaching staff. We have strong tracking processes in

place and we know when things are going well or if there are areas requiring support and improvement. Boarders attend the prep centre from Monday to Thursday evening.



Why be a boarder?

Our boarders build strong, lifelong friendships with both Australian and overseas students.

Your daughter will learn to live away from home and become independent, resourceful, confident and well educated. We encourage our students to completely immerse themselves into life at St Catherine's. Students flourish both socially and emotionally when they engage in the broad cocurricular activities available to them as boarders.

GIVE IT TIME

We recognise that moving to a new school in another country is a significant challenge for our overseas students, and we assure the girls that life will get easier once they the settle into the daily routines and start to form new friendships.

GET INVOLVED

The school offers many cocurricular activities such as drama, sport, music, debating and dance.

All boarders in Years 7–10 must be involved in at least one (preferably two) cocurricular activities each term, which will support their integration into life at St Catherine's.

SEEK ASSISTANCE WHEN YOU NEED

Apart from your daughter's year mentor, there are five boarding staff in residence to support her should she need assistance – even if it's just because she is homesick!

Our Boarding Staff

St Catherine's School has one boarding house, which cares for 67 students from Year 7-12. There is a good mix of girls from Sydney, rural Australia and overseas.

Five permanent boarding staff live on site and are available to assist the girls.

Our boarding team is led by our director of boarding and student engagement Ms Rebecca Herbert and assistant director of boarding Mrs Emily Kazogolo. The team works collaboratively to ensure each boarding student is well supported and nurtured during her time with us.



MS REBECCA HERBERT

Rebecca oversees the boarding house and is responsible for all boarders, their welfare and development. Rebecca has been at the school for 15 years and is a practicing St Catherine's senior school teacher in addition to her director of boarding role. She loves the diversity each day brings and relishes being able to spend time with both day girls and boarding students.

Rebecca is respected for her down to earth, practical, flexible, compassionate, approachable and warm personality by both day and boarding students.



MRS EMILY KAZOGOLO

Emily assists Rebecca in the day to day running of the boarding house. She has been at the school for four years and has been in the assistant director of boarding position for two years. Her passion is music, and she trained as a music teacher, before moving into her current role of assistant head of biblical studies and boarding.

She lives on site in the boarding house, and is the person the boarders raise in the middle of the night should they be unwell or need attention.

Emily is jovial, relatable, a joker, approachable and an extremely friendly and welcoming support staff member for the students.

Mentor time

Your daughter will join a mentor group when she starts at St Catherine's, which will become a significant part of her school life. Our academic care program, delivered through the mentor groups is a vital part of our approach to teaching and learning. Your daughter will feel she belongs, and develop stronger connections with her peers.

Your daughter will be part of a house-based mentor group as soon as she starts in the senior school.

In these small groups, she will be with girls her own age and a teacher. The groups meet twice a week and share their experiences and insights. Authentic relationships and rapport are formed in these groups.

House activities are one of the best ways for students to feel connected to their peers and the school. Students benefit from working collaboratively with each other across year groups. Our older students step up to lead their house and our younger students learn from their role models.

The academic care program also looks at financial literacy, goal setting, safe partying, consent, digital citizenship, mental health awareness, nutrition and healthy habits.

If you have a concern about your daughter, her year mentor would be the first person to contact at school. Or, you may want to pass on some feedback? Again the year mentor is the person to contact.

Living with girls from a variety of backgrounds broadened my understanding of others and helped develop my social and life skills.

The boarding house had just been renovated so the facilities were brand new and really impressive. The long, hot showers were the best! Yes, there were plenty of rules but it still felt like my home away from home and I always felt supported and cared for.

Living on site was a huge positive as it meant I could enjoy additional access to certain school facilities after hours and on weekends such as the research centre, the gym and the pool. It was so convenient to just walk out of the boarding house door and be at class, team trainings or tutoring in two minutes.

For me, it was a privilege to attend St Catherine's School. I was provided with incredible opportunities through academic mentorship and through the Elite Athlete program. When I reflect on my time at St Catherine's, I recall a fun time, and forging lifelong friendships that I will always cherish. Entry requirements at St Catherine's School Sydney

All students are required to sit an English, Mathematics and General Ability test provided by the Australian Education Advisory Services (AEAS) or International Diagnostic and Admissions Test (IDAT). St Catherine's does not accept IELTS.

The AEAS test or IDAT test will determine if an English Language Course for Overseas Students (ELICOS) is required. ELICOS courses are studied in Sydney. St Catherine's has no affiliation with International House (IH Sydney), Mega Education, Times Academy or Pathways Armidale but accepts the integrity of the ELICOS programs they offer.

If ELICOS is required, your daughter's commencement at St Catherine's will be subject to successful completion of ELICOS. Each application is considered on a case-by-case basis, and further entry pre-requisites may be required.

The minimum entry level is listed below

Year level	Minimum score level	Proficiency required
Years 5 – 6	51+	Intermediate
Years 7 – 9	61+	Upper Intermediate
Year 10	71+	Pre-advanced

Enrolment process St Catherine's School Sydney

STEP 1

Submit an online enrolment application and pay the non-refundable application fee (A\$500) and upload a copy of your daughter's:

- Birth certificate
- Passport
- Two most recent school reports (translated and validated by the school or education agent). We recommend you appoint an education agent, refer to our website for approved agents.
- AEAS test or IDAT test result.

STEP 2

Your daughter will have an interview with a member of the senior leadership team (via Zoom or at the school).

- One parent is required to also attend the interview
- Interviews are conducted two years prior to your daughter's intended commencement year, or as required.

STEP 3

If a place exists, a letter of offer will be emailed, with accompanying enrolment documentation

- The letter of offer will indicate the due date of acceptance.
- The letter of offer will indicate if the offer is provisional and subject to successful completion of ELICOS.

STEP 4

The acceptance of enrolment is required by the due date, with payment of the non-refundable, non-transferable enrolment fee (A\$4,000.00).

On receipt of the acceptance and enrolment fee, the Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE) and a Certificate of Appropriate Accommodation and Welfare (CAAW) will be issued. This will support your daughter's student visa application.

STEP 5

Prior to your daughter's commencement the following arrangements are required (additional fees apply):

- Nominate a guardian this can be an English-speaking relative or friend in Sydney or appoint International Student Alliance (ISA) Student Advocate.
- Provide a copy of your daughter's student visa and overseas student health cover (OSHC).
- The boarding house is closed during school holiday term breaks. If your daughter does not have a friend/ relative or will not travel home, the Director of Boarding will assist booking a homestay with the Australian Homestay Network (AHN).
- Payment of one term's tuition fee, boarding fee (if applicable) and the refundable holding deposit (A\$10,000.00) is payable 30 days prior to your daughter's commencement.
- Access is provided to the school's portal and information regarding uniform fitting, textbooks and commencement details will be advised.

STEP 6

Orientation and commencement at St Catherine's School.


